ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is for current, full-time DMAC students who want to take their skills and careers to the next level, whether it's going from an associate's degree to a bachelor's degree or from a bachelor's degree to a master's degree.

MERIT SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is for students who are able to demonstrate their accomplishments within their particular skill sets. HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION

Every year, DMAC holds a drawing competition for high school seniors who are interested in pursuing a career in digital arts. Scholarships awarded include one full undergraduate scholarship towards a bachelor's degree, as well as partial scholarships worth \$20,000 and \$15,000.

EARLY DECISION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is for high school seniors who are passionate about a future in digital arts and want to get an early start on their education and career pursuit. Students are able to begin a semester sooner and, therefore, graduate earlier as well.
